

Alexandros Nikolouzos, lawyer in Athens, LL.M, LL.M.Eur.

Alexandros Nikolouzos is a lawyer based in Athens practicing mainly labor, administrative and criminal law. He graduated in 2002 from the Law School of the University of Athens and he completed consequently two master degree programs in Hamburg and in Bremen, Germany in the fields of constitutional, european and international law. His main academic interests extend to individual and collective labor law, human rights law and public international law.

During his stay in Berlin (2008-2009) he engaged with the work of the European Center of Constitutional and Human Rights, founded by the prominent German criminal law lawyer, Wolfgang Kaleck.

Since his return to Greece (2009) he has been practicing actively law and he has represented before the Greek courts several trade unions and pensioners' associations.

From January 2015 to July 2015 he has been a legal counsel to the Greek Minister of Labor and he contributed to the negotiations of the Ministry with the "Troika". During the same period he worked closely with the Greek Special Secretary of the Labor Inspection Body.
